

## MINUTES

Regular meeting of Rolling Fields City Commission  
2<sup>nd</sup> Presbyterian Church, 6:30pm, November 12, 2009

Those present – Mayor Bill Conway, Commissioners Cliff Krawiec, Beth Moffett, Carolyn Wetterer, Shiela Oliver, Treasurer Joanna Nugent, Clerk Brenda Conway, Chief Kelly Spratt.

**Police Report** – Chief Spratt reported that it has been quiet. An incident was reported on Crocus which is under investigation now. Mayor Conway reported that a resident suggested that notice should be given to residents regarding walking/jogging toward traffic, bikers with traffic. Chief Spratt has some information regarding this that can be shared with residents.

**Prior Meeting Minutes** – Motion moved to approve – Commissioner Wetterer, seconded by Commissioner Moffett. Unanimously approved.

**Preservation Meeting Oct 9<sup>th</sup>** - Commissioner Moffett attended along with Mayor Conway for first half of meeting. Commissioner Moffett reported that same plan was presented that had been presented last January. Mayor Conway expressed disappointment that elevations within the context of the site were not available and urged that they be available before the group next reconvened.

### **Bauer Status/Traffic Issues**

Commissioner Krawiec asked if we should consider writing Rite-Aid corporate. Mayor Conway reported that some Mockingbird Gardens residents had done so previously and Skee Bauer “went ballistic”.

Commissioner Oliver said she did not think anything could stop the redevelopment and the ensuing traffic. After much discussion, the Commission could not agree upon a strategic plan although Commissioner Oliver did agree to contact Councilman Fleming for an update and Commissioner Krawiec would contact Tina Ward-Pugh and Rite-Aid.

### **Recycling:**

Commissioner Wetterer said a resident asked about the possibility of City-provided recycling. Mayor Conway said that the WM contract had been signed last summer ('08) and did not include recycling. He also said that this had considered this before and that it was determined that only 1 out of every 6 or 7 homes were recycling.

### **Treasurer's Report**

Treasurer Nugent reported that residents are taking discounts for City taxes as they had in the past and that all projections are on target. She also shared a letter from KLC urging Kentucky residents to support a “KentuckyCard” drug discount program to be downloaded at [www.kentuckyrcard.com](http://www.kentuckyrcard.com).

**Job Opening**

Commissioner Oliver said that Rachel Schrepferman had expressed interest in serving on the Commission. Brenda Conway suggested Clerk position is open. Mayor Conway will follow-up with Rachel.
